Christingles - Explained!

At Christmas time many people, all over the world, make Christingles. Christingles started at a church in Germany in 1747 when the minister gave each child a candle wrapped in a red ribbon. Since then it has moved around the world and become a big part of Christmas.

So what do Christingles Represent?

The symbolism of each piece of the Christingle was explained by the Worship Team during a Blue Peter Style worship video! We loved filming a special Christingle Worship which included a demonstration of how to make a Christingle, an explanation of the symbolism and some prayers and reflections. We lit our class Christingles and in the candlelight we thought about the real meaning of Christmas as a celebration of the gift of Jesus to us, as light of the world, bringing hope to people living in darkness.


Christingle Fast Facts


- Christingle translated means 'Christ's light'.
- ★ In 1968, the Christingle came into the UK
- ★ The meaning of the Christingle varies according to the season.
- ★ At Advent it represents the hope of light in the darkness, while at Christmas it symbolises the birth of Jesus.
- ★ There were 2,349 1 pence pieces collected by our school community this year!

World Religion - Hinduism Beech Class Get to Know Ganesh



You may recognise Ganesh — he's famous around the world for his elephant head. Having an elephant head makes Ganesh special. He has all the wisdom, loyalty and compassion of an elephant and his large ears mean he can clearly hear the needs of his people.



We found out there are lots of Hindu gods and goddesses, you'll find images or ornaments of Ganesh in most Hindu homes. This is because Hindus believe Ganesh is the "remover of all obstacles," so they pray to him before any ritual or new event because his blessing will make things go smoothly.

We found out that Ganesh has a sweet tooth!

In most images of Ganesh, you'll see him holding some sweets called *laddoos*. These delicious round treats are Ganesh's favourite, and offerings of sweet foods,

like laddoos, are often made to him.

Laddoo is made from chickpea flour, sugar and ghee

Letter from Revd Jax

Dear Sparsholt C of E Primary School Community,

This comes with my heartfelt thanks to you and the children, staff and parents of Sparsholt Primary School for supporting the request for donations to the Emergency Appeal from Karis Kids charity.

As you know, Karis Kids is a Winchester-based charity which supports families in the slums of Kampala, Uganda. Already struggling to cope with the tragic loss of life from AIDs and political unrest in the country, our friends in Kampala have also been hit hard by Coronavirus.

One mother, Marion, is a single parent with a big heart, and she has adopted a number of children whose own parents have died, and they all live together in a very tiny home. They have one room, which serves as a kitchen, living area and bedroom for the whole family. Marion, and other families just like hers, do not have much money to buy basic food items, let alone be able to buy hand-sanitisers and disinfectants to keep their homes and school environments germ free. Your kindness in raising an amazing £807.95 will help them more than I can describe.


The money you have raised by the exceptionally thoughtful and resourceful fund-raising ideas you invented, which have also had to take into account our own need for social distancing and Coronavirus restrictions, is the most fantastic gift to our Karis Kids families you could imagine! 


Now, many families who have been hungry will be able to look forward to a happy Christmas. We will all be able to celebrate the birth of Jesus together with happy hearts and full tummies!


