

## Communication & Language

### Listening and Attention/Understanding

Listening and responding to a variety of stories, during guided reading. Begin to answer more complex comprehension questions. Understanding and following instructions, involving two parts, when carrying out investigations.

### Speaking

Using language to imagine and recreate roles and experiences in the 'Jungle Explorers' role play area, home and small world play. Using talk to sequence and retell the story, 'The Snail and the whale'.

## Physical Development

### Fine Motor

Using simple tools and joining techniques when sewing their animal puppets. To continue to develop pencil control and form all letters correctly.

### Gross Motor

Develop ball skills, including passing and receiving a ball. Learn how to negotiate space when playing running and other team games.

## Personal, Social & Emotional Development

### Building relationships

Explore similarities and differences between self and others and celebrate how special we all are.

### Managing self

Develop an understanding of how to keep others and themselves safe, including practising good hygiene and how to keep their body healthy.

### Self-regulation

Learn to recognise different feelings and the effects they have on themselves. Become confident in sharing and talking about their feelings with others.

### God's World

What are symbols? Why is Easter important to Christians?

## Understanding the World

### People, Culture and communities

Find out about the hot and cold countries of the world. Explore the different foods and traditional dress, learn about Chinese New Year and Shrove Tuesday.

### Past and Present

Find out about the explorer Ernest Shackleton. Compare with explorers today.

### Natural World

Explore different materials and their properties. Develop language for describing material e.g. smooth, rough, and transparent. Investigate which materials would be good for keeping an animal warm in the Arctic. Find out about the habitats of different animals around the world.

## Expressive Arts & Design

### Creating with Materials

Exploring colour and texture to create animal silhouette pictures. Design, sew and evaluate an animal puppet.

### Being Imaginative and expressive

Children will take part in a range of role-play activities in the herb kitchen and imaginative small world scenarios.

## Phonics

Recap set 1 diagraphs and begin to learn set 2 sounds. Focus on blending CVC words in both writing and reading. Learn 'tricky' words by sight.

## Literacy

### Reading

Developing an interest in reading through shared class and group reading sessions as well as individual reading books. Topic related text including 'Lost and Found', 'The Snail and the Whale.' and 'The Tiger who came to tea.'

### Writing

Writing simple sentences to make posters and write captions. Learning facts about different animals to write simple riddles. Making fact files about hot and cold countries and the animals that live there.

## Mathematical Development

### Number

To consolidate understanding of mathematical skills already learnt with numbers to 10. To begin learning about teen numbers. To develop techniques for adding and subtracting using a variety of tools such as part whole models and number lines.

### Shape, Space and Measure

Learn about 2D and 3D shapes. Compare and measure length, height, weight and capacity through a variety of practical activities using non-standard units of measure.
