Geography has taken centre stage in every class this week, as each class has explored the world in different ways. Willow Class have been transported to Africa through reading the story of Handa's Surprise. There was great excitement as the children tasted a selection of fruits featured in the story; mango, pineapple, passion fruit, papaya, oranges and bananas were all highly rated in the taste test! Beech Class have been using their Geography skills closer to home by looking at human and physical features of Sparsholt and Winchester. They have really enjoyed recognising places they know on maps and plans. Maple have loved their expedition to The Ivory Coast, with a mission of researching chocolate production. Rowan have been inspired by their Class Reader, Cloudforest, and have trekked through the rainforest, taking in all the sights and sounds of their journey through Equador.
