# House Point "Scolosaurus" Awards


Following on from last year's owl awards, this year the children who achieve the required number of house points (see below), will come home with a lovely dinosaur "scolosaurus" badge.

# **Important Notices**

### 1. Outdoor Learning Day – Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> June

We are so excited that following the success of last year, Sparsholt School's Outdoor Learning Day is returning for its second year! The children will be spending all day outside, completing lots of nature-themed activities incorporating maths, geography, science and many other topics.

Please can children wear their PE kit to school on this day – children **must** wear **long trousers (leggings or joggers).** We will be outside for most of the day whatever the weather, so please ensure that children bring a coat to school if rain is forecast, or have applied suncream and bring a hat to school if the weather is expected to be good. Please ensure that your child brings a water bottle to school.

2. In-app messages - Arbor

The school is using in-app messages as a quick and easy way to communicate with parents. Please ensure that you have turned notifications on so that you are notified when a new message is sent and do not miss out on important information.

# 7. Information from the Hampshire & Isle of Wight Constabulary

This week our Years 5 and 6 were lucky enough to have a really informative talk from an Education Partnership Officer from Hampshire Police. One focus of the talk was around online safety and the police have also provided some online safety guidance for parents and carers. Please see the document attached separately to this newsletter.

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# 8. A message from Hampshire Transport

Over 90% of families in Hampshire make their own journeys to school. They walk, cycle, use public transport, lift-share with other families or take their child to school in the family car. Visit Hampshire County Council's **Travel to school page** for information.

The County Council understands that for a minority of children, particularly those with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND), there are exceptional reasons why they are unable to get to school, even with the help of families or friends. In these situations, the County Council may be able to provide free transport assistance. This is available for eligible children from **the term after their fifth birthday up to and including year 11**.

You can visit the Hampshire County Council website to <u>check whether your child is eligible for free</u> <u>transport assistance</u>. If you believe your child meets the eligibility criteria, and you need help getting them to school, you can <u>apply now for transport assistance</u> for the 2024/25 school year.

If your child already receives School Transport, **you don't need to do anything** unless your circumstances have changed. If you have moved home or school location, you will need to **reapply for transport**.

### **Application Deadlines**

Applications for School Transport for 2024/25 must be submitted by the following applicable dates.

### Late applications

Applications received after the applicable date will be treated as late applications, and will only be reviewed after all on-time applications have been processed. This means that **transport will not be in place for September 2024 and may not be available for the first academic term**.

### What next?

Providing your application is submitted on time, you can expect to hear back from us with the outcome of your application within 15 working days. This may vary during busier periods. For approved applications, you will then receive a second communication detailing your child's transport arrangements, and this will be sent to you no later than the end of August.

Dear Parent(a)/ Carer(a),

On Saturday 8<sup>th</sup> June 2024, Kings' School will be hosting their annual Summer Fayre. Previously we have hosted a Year 3.4.5 and 6 Biathlon prior to the Fayre commencing and we are keen to do this once again. The Biathlon will begin at 10:30am, however, registration will begin at 10:15am and I would ask all competitors and parents to be present and arrive no later than 10:25am. Following the Biathlon, parents and pupils are then welcome to attend the School Fayre.

The Biathlon event will consist of a 100m swim immediately followed by a 1km run for Years 5 and 6 and a 50m swim immediately followed by an 800m run for Years 3 & 4. Pupils will compete in waves of their own age and gender and it is intended that this event is a personal challenge as opposed to a timed event. All pupils will be encouraged to move up the rankings within their wave, however, they will not be positioned. For this reason, we would like to have as many competitors as possible and make this a challenging mass participation event.

Upon completion of the Biathlon, all pupils will receive a medal and small goodie bag for their achievement. We hope that as many families as possible can stay for a while to enjoy the day and have some fun.
