Dear Parents and Carers,

What a week it has been! Thank you so much to all of you who attended the KS2 Maths Parent Workshop on Monday. Thank you also for the positive comments we received from parents who said they found it both useful and informative. We are already looking forward to the KS1 Maths Parent Workshop which is due to take place on the 18<sup>th</sup> March 2024 at 3:45pm. We will send further information about this event nearer the time.

On Tuesday, we had 20 Ancient Egyptians in Maple Class who were busily making papyrus, writing in hieroglyphics, making Egyptian bread and having a thoroughly fantastic day learning all about the Ancient Egyptian culture. Everyone looked fantastic and the creativity around the staff and the children's outfits was phenomenal.

This week I have had the pleasure of being in both Willow and Beech Classes and I can't tell you how wonderful it is to see the enthusiasm with which the children approach their learning. In Beech Class we were learning about the Creation Story in RE and the children wrote their own prayer of thanks about things on the Earth. The children's reasons for being thankful for things from dogs and cats to plants and trees was so uplifting. One of my favourites was being thankful for flamingos because of the elegance they show when balancing on one leg!

In Willow Class, they have been practising their subtraction skills and we had a very enjoyable time playing an addition and subtraction game in the outside area which the children were thoroughly engaged with. They were also having a wonderful time following different recipes for things from twig tea to leaf soup and I was served a variety of 'delicious' items with the children using their counting skills to put in the right numbers of each ingredient.

Can I say thank you so much to all of you who have already signed up to the Arbor App. As you know, we have now transferred our payment system over and trips and clubs will also be able to be booked and paid for through Arbor. The In-App messaging system is also such a fantastic addition as we are able to send short reminders and share urgent messages through it. Arbor also gives you the opportunity to check your emergency contact details and your child's attendance etc. The Arbor system has a number of other useful features which we will be rolling out as the year progresses.

Next week we are very much looking forward to celebrating National Children's Mental Health Week and have many wonderful things planned. Each day will have a different focus, with activities taking place to help the children understand ways in which they can manage their mental health and strategies to support positive wellbeing. There may even be a tech-free challenge for families to partake in! Please do remember that on the school's website under the Support for Parents tab: Support for Parents there is a whole realm of information on our Padlet that can help support you as parents with some of the challenges your children may be dealing with at home. We will also be celebrating Safer Internet Day on Tuesday with children learning about how to use the internet responsibly.

We have finished the week with our amazing worship team re-enacting the inspiring life of Nelson Mandela. They explained how he protested against the unfair treatment of people based on the colour of their skin and how this was referred to as apartheid and that despite being imprisoned for his beliefs, he never gave up the fight for freedom, justice and equality. They really are a talented group of pupils who share some really important messages with the other children.

Thank you again for all the wonderful support you continue to show us as a school and thank you for all you do to support your children with their learning. I hope you all have a wonderful weekend.

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## Arbor Update

#### 1. Payments

We are now using payments in the Arbor Parent Portal!

You can make payments and top up your child's account for **school meals** by simply logging into the Parent Portal or Arbor App. **Your balances from SCOPAY have been transferred across to Arbor and will also show in the Parent Portal.** 

Payments for clubs, trips, music tuition and wraparound care will also be able to be made on the Parent Portal / Arbor App - these will be set up at the time that a new club / trip is initiated. We will provide further details shortly.

#### 2. In-app messages and notifications

**Please ensure that you have notifications from Arbor enabled on your device(s).** All non-urgent school communications e.g. reminders about events in school, are now being sent via in-app messages. If you have notifications enabled, you will be made aware of new messages from the School without having to log-into your Arbor app.
