The following year this became our annual Christmas light trail (which she always helped to create).

Many of these events have been accompanied by a glass of wine or two and lots of giggles. The most recent adventure enjoyed by many was our walk in the Brecon Beacons where 20 of us mums had fun whilst raising money for the school.

Widge was one of us, a proud mum to three gorgeous children, a dear friend and a loyal supporter of FoSS. We will all miss her. Thank you for being there for us. Xxx
