Dear Parents and Carers,

We have had another fabulous week here with so many of the children getting some wonderful topic related learning opportunities that not only provided them with some first-hand experiences but also showed their enthusiasm for what they have been learning about.

On Tuesday, Maple class had their Ancient Egyptian day with everyone looking fantastic in their Egyptian style costumes. The creativity around what everyone was wearing was a real spectacle and the eye for detail in terms of the accessories such as jewellery pieces and makeup was fantastic. The children all had an amazing day learning about the ancient Egyptian art of bread making, creating their own papyrus paper and writing in hieroglyphics. They also mummified tomatoes and will be observing what happens to them over the coming weeks. In addition, the children had a number of really interesting ancient Egyptian artefacts that they were able to handle and study in detail. A lot of discussion was had around what each of the artefacts could have been used for with the children using their historical detective skills to come up with some really interesting theories and ideas.

Yesterday, Willow and Beech class visited the SeaCity Museum in Southampton as part of their study of the Titanic. Being lucky enough to accompany them, I have to say how wonderful they all were and how impressed I was with the enthusiasm every single one of them showed. Not only was I (and the SeaCity museum staff) blown away by the children's recall of information they had already learned about the Titanic but also their skills at looking at artefacts and supporting their thoughts about their uses. As part of the day, the children had the opportunity to dress up as both crew and passengers of the Titanic, learn about different sections of the ship from the 1st class gymnasium to the boiler room and undertake experiments around the theory (all but flawed) of the unsinkable nature of the Titanic due to its compartmental design. They even learned about many of the failings that led to the disaster including that none of the lookout crew had been provided with binoculars, let alone searchlights to help them look out for icebergs and other dangers.

Next week, we have another packed schedule of events linked to Children's Mental Health Week. This year's theme is 'Connection'. There will be so many amazing activities going on from "star breathing" to outdoor scavenger hunts. We will also be focusing on Internet Safety as this can also have a negative impact on mental health. On Friday it will be 'Dress to Express' day with children able to come into school dressed in clothing that they have special connections with e.g. team kit, favourite colour, uniforms etc. Please see the separate e-mail for further details.

Please don't forget that on Tuesday at 3.45pm we are holding a Phonics workshop for the parents of children in Year R and 1. If you have not yet confirmed whether you will be attending please can you do so at your earliest convenience. At 6pm on Tuesday we will also be holding the KS2 SATs information evening for our Year 6 parents, again can you please confirm if you will be attending.

Finally, please note that we have added an additional date to our calendar for our 'Easter Presentation' which will take place on the afternoon of the 30th March 2023 (details to follow). After the event, our amazing FoSS team will be holding an Easter Fayre from 3.30pm.
