2. Payment for school meals for KS2

The school requires that school lunches (for KS2) are paid in advance, on a half-termly basis. The current price for a school lunch is £3.20. For administrative purposes, wherever possible, the school would prefer payment to be made online using the Arbor website or app. The school's charging policy is on the school website for reference. 3. Payment for keyboard, recorder and brass music tuition for Autumn Term 2024

As per the school charging policy, music tuition for keyboard, recorder and brass must be paid for termly in advance, and commitment to music tuition is for a whole year. Guitar and ukulele tuition is now run by an external provider, Winchester Academy of Modern Music. Information letters were sent at the end of last term for all those who had signed up for music tuition, and payments were added to your child's Arbor account, under "clubs". Please can I ask that payment is made as soon as possible and in advance of your child's first lesson next week. Thank you.

7. Year 7 Secondary School Applications

For parents of our current Year 6 children, please remember that applications for your child's Year 7 secondary school place open on Monday 9th September and close on 31st October 2024.

8. School Car Park Guidelines

We would like to remind you of our car parking guidelines:

- Please do **not** move your cars when the children walk to or from the bus. We would request that you remain stationery for a few minutes longer and allow the children to safely make their way across the car park
- Please do not park over the marked pedestrian walk-ways in the car-park
- Post Office staff, Sparsholt Parish Council and Sparsholt residents kindly request that you do not park in Woodman Lane, especially outside the Post Office. Parking directly outside the Post Office (where the white lines are painted) impedes our school coach which then blocks the road completely. Be aware that the service bus also needs to get through each hour.
- There are 3 parking bays closest to the shop which are for the use of Post Office/Shop staff.
- For safety reasons, please refrain from parking in the entrance to the car park

- If you double-park in the car-park please drop off or pick up your child/children promptly so allowing others to get away as quickly as possible.
- An alternative to the car park would be to park in Woodman Close and walk up to school through the pathway at the back of the playground we recommend this option. Please be careful not to impede disabled bays or private driveways in front of some of the houses in the Close.
- Please make full use of the bus if your child has a pass.
- Finally we ask you to be courteous at all times to other users of the car park.
