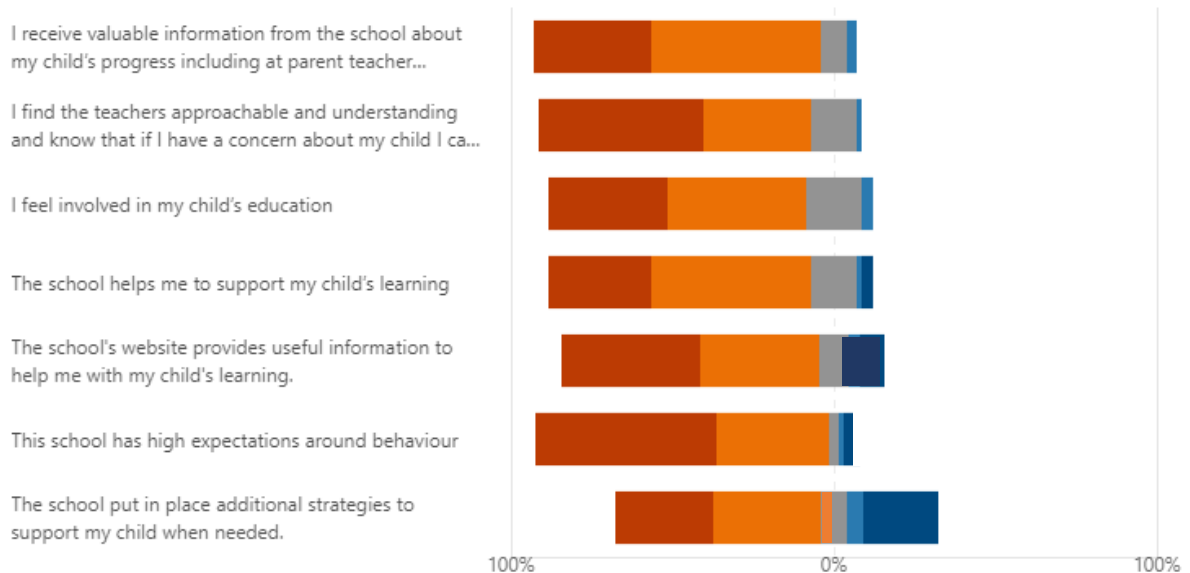

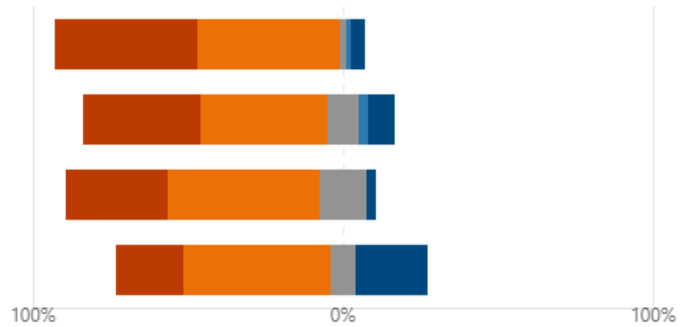

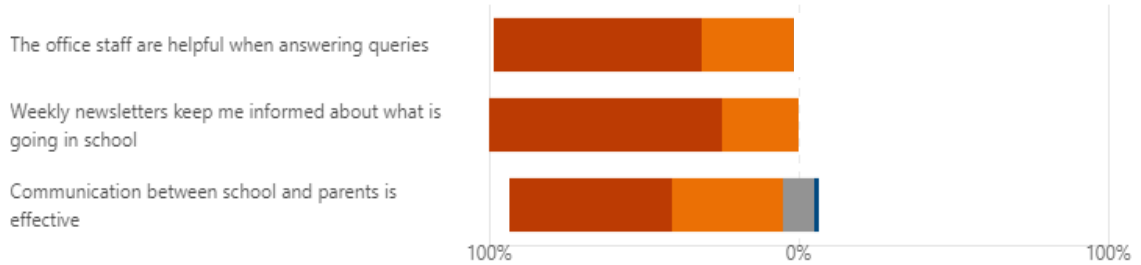

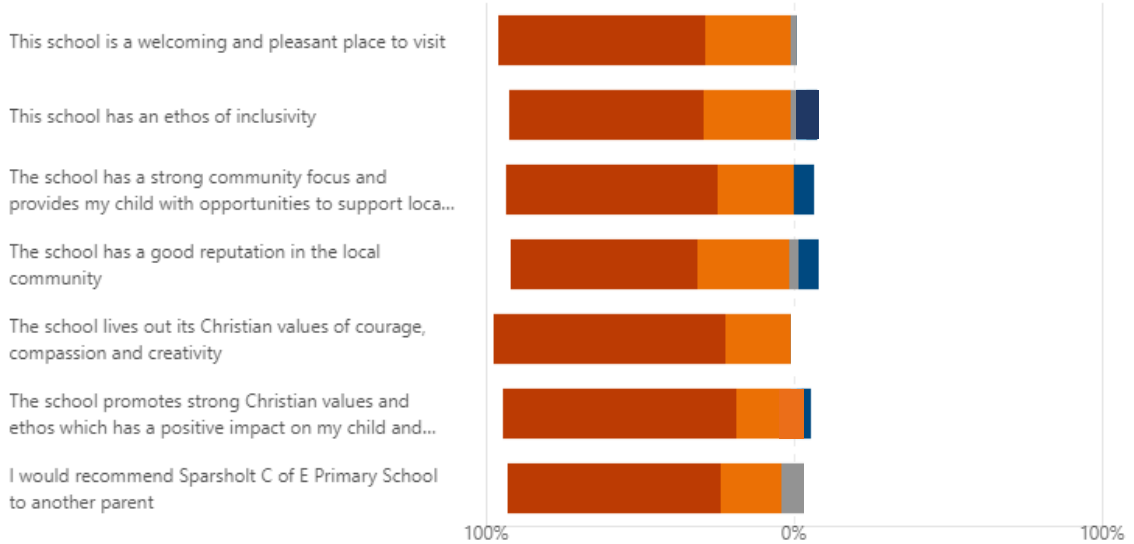

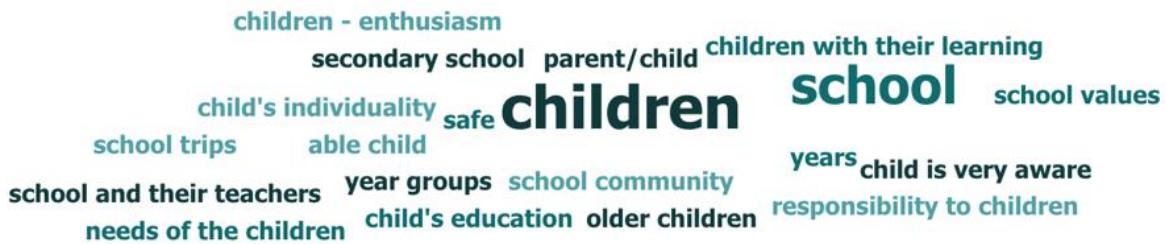

## Common themes

Thank you to all of you who completed the free text boxes at the end of the survey. We have collated your responses and pulled out the common themes which are as follows:

### What we do well:



- Creating a nurturing environment, where the children feel safe and secure to learn and develop into confident & inquisitive young people!
- Inclusive, welcoming, fun and safe environment.
- Promoting independence within the older children and getting them ready to take on secondary school, by creating a positive and nurturing environment where they can safely learn to express themselves and build their confidence.
- Enriching activities to enhance the curriculum,
- Giving age appropriate responsibility to children to embed a sense of pride/confidence.
- Any small issues (e.g. friendship/playground issues) are dealt with quickly and effectively, ensuring the school's Christian values are implemented.

- Creating a sense of community and building relationships amongst peer groups.
