✓ Monday 20th January – Oak and Maple Class Outdoor Learning sessions

Dear Parents and Carers,

Whilst the temperatures have remained low this week, the children's energy and enthusiasm levels have remained high. They have continued to show both determination and focus in their learning especially around the new topics they are learning about this term. Please do look out for the Spring Term topic overview and jigsaws / home learning information coming out via e-mail today.

We started the week by reminding children about 'Yum Yum the Yeti' and our work around the Growth Mind-Set. The children were excellent at remembering how important the power of 'yet' is and how we need to maintain a growth mind-set if we are going to succeed and progress.

Willow Class have loved starting their new topic, with the children learning all about Antarctica and some of the animals that live there. Due to the very cold temperatures, there has even been an icy habitat that has formed in the Willow Class outside area that contains polar bears, whales and icebergs! The children have very much enjoyed learning all about emperor penguins and even used their maths skills to make 2D penguin art!

Beech Class have been enraptured by the story, 'The Snail and the Whale' which they are reading as part of their topic, 'Water, Water Everywhere'. They are loving hearing about all of the snail's adventures and the places he has visited and also learning about how important courage is.

Egypt and the Ancient Egyptians have been the focus in Maple Class with the children using their geographical skills to find out where Egypt is and starting to look at the amazing history of this wondrous country.

Rowan Class have been studying about somewhere slightly closer to home and looking at Southampton and in particular the port and its links to the rest of the world. The children have researched the routes that some of the cruise ships take especially to warmer climes!

Oak Class have been discussing and researching aspects of meteorology and thinking about how they can measure local weather conditions including temperature, wind speed and humidity and have been coming up with solutions as to how to enhance outdoor learning resources to allow accurate data capture of these elements within our school grounds.

In regards to our outdoor learning, we have the Hampshire and IOW Trust in again this Monday (20th) to work with Oak and Maple Class who will be using their Maths skills to solve different challenges in the school grounds. The new pond dipping deck is now able to be used and we have some amazing students from Sparsholt Agricultural College coming in in a few weeks to clear some of the vegetation within the pond itself so that the children can start pond dipping. We are incredibly grateful to Sparsholt Agricultural College for all their amazing help and support with this project.

Whilst the temperatures are still looking cold, I very much hope you are able to get outside and have an enjoyable and fun weekend.
